From the Chaplain....

'At the King's CE School we believe that everyone is unique and created in God's image...' and this week we have been celebrating our Harvest Festival, thanking God for his generosity to us and remembering that we too were 'created for generosity'. It has been a real pleasure to see the abundance of gifts brought in by our pupils and staff to support local food-banks this week and to hear from foodbank volunteers about the difference our gifts will make to individuals and to families in our city. It has also been good to hear from colleagues as they reflected this week on how generosity of spirit is so much more than just material giving, but reflects a deeper attitude of gratitude and of compassion for others.

All this got me thinking that the way in which we give can vary greatly across different cultures. In this country we tend to be fairly quiet and private about our acts of charity. Many colleagues and pupils quietly passed on their harvest donations this week without wanting to make their donation in public. This reminds me of verses from Matthew's gospel:

"Watch out! Don't do your good deeds publicly, to be admired by others, for you will lose the reward from your Father in heaven. When you give to someone in need, don't do as the hypocrites do—blowing trumpets in the synagogues and streets to call attention to their acts of charity! I tell you the truth, they have received all the reward they will ever get. But when you give to someone in need, don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing. Give your gifts in private, and your Father, who sees everything, will reward you." (Matt 6:1-4)

Through my links with Ghanaian churches I have seen another way of giving. Whilst the gift itself is just as private, there is a joy at being able to make the gift which is celebrated and enjoyed through music and dance. This joy at being in a position to make a gift for God's work is also scriptural:

Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Cor 9:7)

With so many in our world and in our own communities in need at the moment we are reminded of just how fortunate we are with the people we care about and the resources we sometimes take for granted in our lives. And whatever we feel able to give, and however we choose to do it, let's just be glad that we can!
