## Instructions

1. Read all of the information cards on the next page.  
*(You may wish to print and cut them out or simply read them and make notes)*
2. Once you have read through the information cards, see if you can sort them into groups using 'post it' notes to make headings e.g. 'Information about Daniel'.
  - Some of the information may not be relevant to answering the question.
  - What headings have you grouped your information under? (There is no limit to the number of headings)
